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#### Principal's Report

Welcome back to BRPS for another term. For a number of reasons, Term 4 is always very exciting and as usual we have a lot of things planned for our student and their families to participate in. This term we will elect our 2019 student leaders, enjoy the day together as we celebrate Grandparents Day, hold a Parent Helpers Morning Tea to thank everyone who contributes positively to our school, complete our Kindergarten Orientation Program, watch the children perform at the Talent Quest and the End of Year Concert, celebrate achievement at our Reward and Presentation Days and farewell our year 6 students as they prepare to move onto high school. It makes me exhausted just thinking about it!

#### School Leaders 2019

We have begun the 2019 School Leaders process to elect our leaders for next year. Nominated students have been asked to complete an application form and in a couple of weeks, these students will give a short speech to their Year 5 peers, as well as the Year 5 Teachers and the Executive Staff. From here, the top 12-16 students will be announced and they will have the opportunity to deliver a more developed speech to the school body who will then vote for the 2019 school leaders. This process is a long one but only highlights how much importance we put on being a school leader at Bennett Road. It is a real honour to be selected to represent your school in this way and I wish all of the nominated students well in their endeavour to become a 2019 Bennett Road PS leader.

#### Kindergarten Orientation

This year we have made some changes to our Kindergarten Orientation. Already we have had 4 weeks of 'lead in' visits which have been running on a Wednesday afternoon. These will continue to run over the next 4 weeks so any families who have not been attending still have plenty of time to get involved. These visits offer the teachers the opportunity to view next year students, assess personalities, develop early friendships, and understand individual needs. For our parents it offers an opportunity to hear about some of the things that will happen in the classroom and to see them first-hand. It also highlights those children who might find it difficult to



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separate from their parents so that we can be prepared with strategies for next year. Following these visits, in week 8 we will be holding a Teddy Bear's Picnic so that our 2019 kindergarten students can meet our 2018 kindergarten group. We think so highly of this years kindergarten and think they will be positive role models in 2019. The following week we have our Kindergarten Expo where parents will get a greater insight into what to expect next year as well as to meet all the different people who make up Bennett Road PS. To date, we have good numbers of children who have enrolled for next year but we are always looking for more. If you know anyone in our community, who has a kindergarten aged child and they have not yet enrolled at our school can you please let them know now is the time.

#### **Granparents Day**

We are more than aware of the extraordinary contributions that our grandparents make to our school and to the greater community and so, on Thursday 8<sup>th</sup> November; we will be celebrating Grandparents Day. This has been a fantastic day in recent year and I would love to see a huge crowd again this year.

#### **Granparents as Carers**

Something else that we have started this year is a support group for our grandparents who are either full time or part time carers of their grandchildren. We actually have a lot of grandparents who play a significant role in their grandchildren's lives and we know how hard that can be. Our last morning tea saw about 12 of our grandparents attend and it was a great opportunity to speak to others who are experiencing the same thing. On the day they shared stories and phone numbers and we would love this group to expand even further. Our next morning tea for this group is next week on Thursday 1<sup>st</sup> November beginning at 9.15am. Our focus for discussion will be on 'Self Care' and we will explore the types of things that our grandparents do to ensure that they are healthy and in a good head space to look after their grandchildren. We hope to see our grandparents there.



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#### Multipurpose Court

I'm sure that everyone who has visited the school recently has seen that there is a major project occurring at the front of the school. For those who are unaware, we are



putting in a multipurpose play court for our students. It is classed as multipurpose because it will be able to accommodate games of netball, basketball and volleyball/newcombe ball as well as offer a hard surface for many other learning opportunities. This project has been a long time in the making, in fact it is something that Mr Sheen and I started about 18 months

ago, but as you can imagine there are a lot of hoops to jump through when you take on a major project like this one. Thankfully this year Mrs Sharwood has taken over the management of the project and now it is full steam ahead. The court will consist of a

reversible tower at either end that will have basketball on one side and netball on the other. On the sides we are going to have an additional 4 basketball rings (2 on each side) and we will be able to put up posts to create 3 volleyball courts that run the length of the court. We are hopeful that it will be completed by the end of the year but of course weather always plays a part in these types



of jobs so we will wait and see. This should be a wonderful addition to our school and I look forward to seeing the children enjoying it for many years to come.

However, as this is usually during our school holidays we like to celebrate it on the last Friday in October each year. This happens to be today! This is a day set aside to recognise those people who dedicate their life to the education of others. 
#### Mount Druitt/ Minchinbury Public Speaking Competition




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#### Parent survey
